### **About Fringe:**

Fringe, EMF’s concert series that spotlights a wide variety of musical genres, began May 15 and features seven concerts. This season’s offerings range from gypsy jazz to mountain music, Creole to country, blues to pops and its second annual Chamber Crawl to appease even the most diverse music aficionados.
